

Mezuzah

(door-frame/gate-post)

Print the 2 pages front and back on one page. Use this to check your mezuzah scroll that you have bought. You will need to use the cross reference map of Ancient Hebrew located at whyalive.com/map.html. Mark off each letter on this sheet as you check the mezuzah scroll. Once you have checked your mezuzah scroll, roll it up from the right side with the words on the inside, so the LORD's name of CUM/Shaddai can be seen on the outside. Place the mezuzah scroll in a case right side up so Shaddai can be read (not upside down) and attach it to the door frame or gatepost on the right side as you are entering the doorway. Nail in place the case 1/3 the way down on the frame or post with the top slightly tilted toward the inside, so the mezuzah is at the same height as if you were going to attach a horizontal beam to the frame or post in order to make a cross. Do this for any outside doors or gates that will have people or livestock within them.

Main word is underlined; prefixes and suffixes not underlined; (added words for clarification); alt-definition/alternative-def; [Aleph-Tav] is in the text, but is never shown or translated in English translations. YESHUA calls HIMSELF the Aleph-Tav/Alpha-Omega.
